#### 1st SRS Memorabilia

The SR-71 squadron's artifacts have been permanently moved from the Omaha Museum to the National Museum of the USAF in Dayton, Ohio. To fund the move, donations were sent in from former crew members, maintenance, tech reps, and intel folks. The response was overwhelming! Over \$3,300 was contributed and after the bills were paid, the remaining money was donated to the Jerry O'Malley Memorial Foundation and will be used for General O'Malley's exhibit/ museum area to be located in Carbondale, Pa. Included in this exhibit will be a model SR-71 and other significant memorabilia of Jerry's association with the SR-71 program.

The move took place in early October. This was not an easy task...moving around 2,000 pounds of squadron artifacts cross country. Under the leadership of Pat Halloran and our Habu volunteers in the Omaha area, everything went as smoothly as possible. A moving company was hired to make the move. The Omaha group included Charlie Daubs, Harlon Hain, Lee Shelton and Harlon's daughter, Alesa Hime. On hand to receive the artifacts was Joe Hofle, staff member of the museum. Thanks to each of you!

### 2005 & 2007 Video Presentations

Leland Haynes produced another presentation in a DVD format for the **2007** Banquet with four chapters: New York-London 1974 speed run; the 1976 speed/altitude records; Beale AFB today (U-2 and Global Hawk ops); and 250 images of folks associated with the Blackbird Programs over the last 25 years.

The **2005** CD-ROM format banquet PowerPoint presentation includes a 25-year history of the SR-71 and U-2 Blackbird achievements; Earth photos taken from a U-2 at 70,000 feet, photos of prominent people that have contributed to the success of the Blackbird programs and a 14 minute movie presentation of the SR-71 takeoff, touch-and-go landings, refueling with a KC-135Q tanker and close-up aerial shots of the SR-71 inflight, including afterburners lighting. On September 19<sup>th</sup>, at CIA Headquarters, a dedication ceremony was held to honor the recent acquisition of an A-12 (article 128) to their museum. The ceremony was attended by A-12 pilots, Ken Collins, Jack Layton, Frank Murray, and Denny Sullivan. Spouses and family members of the deceased A-12 pilots were also present.

The dedication ceremony was held outdoors under a large pavilion tent with food and drink provided. The guest speaker was General Hayden, Director of the Central Intelligence Agency. His speech was right on the mark! After the ceremony, the museum director, Toni Hiley, gave a personal tour of their indoor CIA Museum. She calls it, "The world's largest museum not open to the public."

Autographed copies of a new 55-page booklet titled, "*Archangel: CIA's Supersonic A-12 Reconnaissance Aircraft*" were available to attendees. The CIA Chief Historian, David Robarge, was on hand to autograph and talk about his booklet. Hundreds of CIA documents pertaining to the A-12 program were declassified in conjunction with the dedication ceremony. #### HABUs at Oshkosh

Every year at the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Headquarters in Oshkosh, WI, there is a world class air show sponsored by the EAA. It goes on for seven days and this year the dates are Monday, July 28 through Sunday, August 3. It is the kind of air show anyone associated with aviation sould put on their "bucket list" before they checkout...it is an amazing air show with myriad military static displays and airborne flying. The F-22 Raptor has been stealing the airshow scene recently with its dazzling performance. In order to see everything there you may want to allow for two full days.

One of the most difficult parts of going to Oshkosh is finding a place to stay. Booking a hotel room in Fond du Lac (about 20 min drive to EAA) may require a full year advance reservation! Some have obtained dormitory rooms at local colleges that offer them for rent and provide daily transportation to and from the air show.

Over the last few years we've put on an SR-71 Symposium on each Saturday, with 5 or so Habus on the panel. There might be more Habus show up than can participate at the Saturday event, but at the same time, we might be able to hold some other Habu panels in their forum tents that run daily. They also have an "authors corner" where book authors can meet, greet and let EAA sell their books (lots of paperwork though).
